The focus of the last month, October, was on World Polio Day, falling on the 24th of October, and on breast cancer awareness, as October is the month dedicated to breast cancer globally.



This November, as we celebrate The Rotary Foundation, I invite you to consider not only what we give but why we give. The Foundation is more than a fund for projects. It is the beating heart of our promise that service, rooted in trust and friendship, can create lasting change.

Our Foundation is not about what we can do alone but what we can do together. Each contribution, no matter its size, joins with others to create a collective act of faith in humanity and in the future.

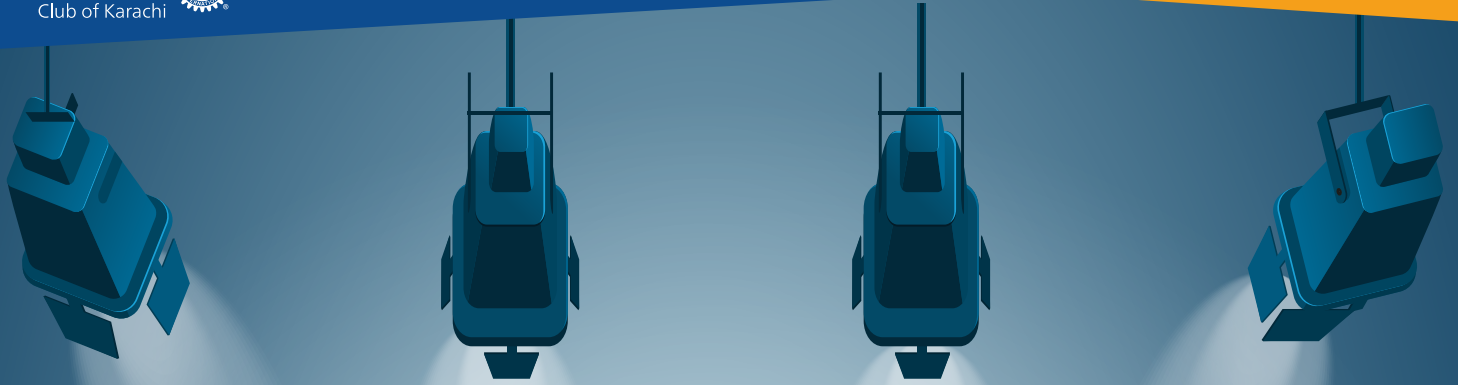

He has authored 11 books, including *Creation of Bangladesh: Myths Exploded*, and *India: An Apartheid State*, translated into several languages, along with his recent publications *China Leads* and *China Leads: The World Listens*. He is a member of Board of Governors and a life member of Karachi Council on Foreign Relations

Key Insights from the Talk

1. CPEC has grown from \$46B to \$62B, boosting Pakistan's energy and infrastructure, including 5,000+ MW power and upgraded motorways, while Gwadar evolves as a strategic port.
2. Progress, however, faces debt concerns, security threats, slow SEZ development, and geopolitical pressure from India and West.
3. CPEC 2.0 shifts toward industrialization, economic integration, and broader social development.
4. Priority areas: SEZs, agriculture modernization, digital connectivity, socio-economic uplift, and accelerated Gwadar growth, driven more by private investment and FDI.
5. Success depends on political stability, secure environments. and effective project execution.

His career began in 1976 with Pakistan National Shipping Corporation. As CEO of SeaCare Pakistan, founded in 1999, he specializes in ship management and marine consultancy. He also currently serves as General Secretary of the Pakistan Merchant Navy Officers' Association.

Key Insights from the Talk

1. Blue Economy means sustainable ocean use for growth, jobs, and livelihoods while protecting ocean health.
2. Maritime shipping carries 80%+ of global trade but is carbon-intensive and environmentally risky.
3. The core challenge is aligning shipping with blue economy principles while balancing benefits and obstacles.
4. Key threats include, overfishing, acidification, climate change, industrial/sewage waste, plastics, oil spills, invasive species, wetland loss, agricultural runoff.
5. Pakistan needs clear blue economy policies with defined mandates, accountability, and IMO/UN CLOS-aligned maritime laws.

Dr Adnan A. Jabbar is Professor and Chairman of the Department of Medical Oncology, Ziauddin Hospital. He is the Ex-President of the Society of Medical Oncology, Pakistan. Dr Jabbar received his medical education from Dow University and later moved to USA where he received his PhD in Immunology. He completed his Internal Medicine training from NUMC, New York and Hematology/ Medical oncology fellowship from Emory USA. He is an expert in solid malignancies with special interest in neuro-oncology, breast, GI and GU malignancies. He has several manuscripts to his name and has served as PI in many phase 3 clinical trials.



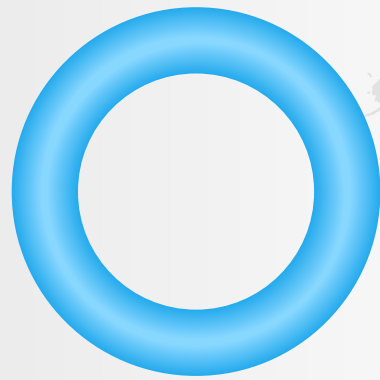

- Trustee Aziz Memon addressed the members on World Polio Day and RCK’s Padelathon event held in its support.
- Focused on Breast Cancer Awareness Month, the meeting highlighted RCK’s ongoing campaign, with four sessions conducted during the past week, at Midas Safety (45 participants), Beaconhouse School (25 participants), BankIslami (80 participants), and IDEAS (110 participants), bringing the month’s total to 13 sessions.
- Rtn. Shumaila Omar, BCA Chairperson, shared campaign highlights, followed by an awareness video.
- PP Ajaz Saya, Community Service Lead, concluded with remarks on RCK’s ongoing health initiatives and a video of MMIH.
- President introduced guest speaker, Dr. Adnan Jabbar, who gave a knowledgeable and insightful presentation on “Hope, Healing, and Truth: A New Conversation About Breast Cancer.”

Key Insights from the Talk

Dr. Jabbar explained that breast cancer arises from genetic mutations causing abnormal cell growth that can spread through lymph nodes.

1. Over 220,000 U.S. women are diagnosed annually, with 40,000 deaths; in Pakistan, it remains the most prevalent cancer among women.
2. Risk factors include age, heredity, obesity, poor diet, inactivity, alcohol, and hormone therapy, with men over 60 also vulnerable.
3. Treatment involves surgery, chemotherapy, radiation, hormone, and targeted therapies, alongside holistic support.
4. Early detection through self-exams and mammograms after 40 significantly improves survival.
5. Dr. Jabbar emphasized that breast cancer isn’t contagious or always fatal, urging greater awareness and regular screening.



WORLD DIABETES DAY

Every year on 14th November, the world observes World Diabetes Day (WDD), uniting over one billion people across 160 countries to raise awareness about one of the most pervasive health challenges of our time. Established in 1991 by the International Diabetes Federation (IDF) with support from the World Health Organization (WHO) and later recognized by the United Nations in 2006, this global campaign commemorates the birthday of Sir Frederick Banting, who co-discovered insulin in 1922, alongside Charles Best; a discovery that continues to save millions of lives each year. This year's theme, "Diabetes and Well-being," focuses on supporting the physical, mental, and social health of people living with diabetes through inclusive, stigma-free environments.

Diabetes develops when the body produces insufficient insulin, or is unable to use it effectively, causing glucose to accumulate and damage organs and blood vessels over time. It includes Type 1 (autoimmune destruction of insulin-producing cells), Type 2 (insulin resistance or inadequate production), and Gestational diabetes (occurring during pregnancy with risks to both mother and child). Symptoms like excessive thirst, frequent urination, fatigue, blurred vision, and slow healing are often overlooked, allowing the disease to progress silently. Yet with early diagnosis and proper management, most complications can be prevented.

The global scale of diabetes is staggering. The IDF Diabetes Atlas 2024 reports that 589 million adults (20–79) are currently living with diabetes, a number expected to reach 853 million by 2050, nearly doubling within 30 years. Alarming, 43% remain undiagnosed, often discovering their condition only after serious complications emerge. In 2024 alone, over 3.4 million deaths were linked to diabetes, while annual global spending has surpassed USD 1 trillion.

Closer to home, the situation in our country is even more alarming. Pakistan now ranks first globally in diabetes prevalence, with an age-standardized rate of 31.4% among adults aged 20 to 79. According to IDF estimates, 34.5 million Pakistanis are currently living with diabetes, a number projected to double to 70 million by 2050, surpassing even the United States. Each year, approximately 230,000 deaths in Pakistan are linked to diabetes and its complications. Equally concerning is that over 9 million adults remain undiagnosed, placing them at grave risk of preventable disabilities such as blindness, kidney failure, and limb amputations.

Pakistan now ranks first globally in diabetes prevalence, with an age-standardized rate of 31.4% among adults aged 20 to 79. According to IDF estimates, 34.5 million Pakistanis are currently living with diabetes, a number projected to double to 70 million by 2050, surpassing even the United States.

Just as Rotary International has played a historic role in eradicating polio, it is now at the forefront of addressing diabetes through the Rotary Action Group for Diabetes (RAGD). The RAGD serves as a global platform that mobilizes Rotarians across 160 countries to combat diabetes through five focus areas that are awareness, prevention, treatment, management, and complication control.

At the Rotary Club of Karachi Artificial Limbs Centre, many amputees are underprivileged diabetic patients unaware of the risks of untreated diabetes. To address this, RCK, in partnership with MMI Hospital and HASWA, established a Diabetes Clinic in December 2024, offering free consultations, medicines, and lab tests, with specialist referrals when needed. Staffed by a full-time trained doctor, it has already served over 1,500 patients, advancing Rotary's mission from rehabilitation to prevention through awareness, timely intervention, and compassionate service.

The fight against diabetes requires collective action. With its global network, Rotary is equipped to transform awareness into access and impact. On World Diabetes Day 2025, we reaffirm our commitment to prevention, early detection, and compassionate care for all.

District 3271 News

In October, with the World Polio Day falling on October 24, it was not surprising that the clubs of District 3271 enthusiastically observed the Day through various different activities. In this section we give you some glimpses of what different clubs got up to. Once again, our regrets that not all clubs in the District could be covered, as ultimately we do have a space constraint.
